Approval of September 10 meeting minutes: Lisa motioned to approve, Joan seconded; unanimously approved.

Trustee Business:

Pickleball Court CPC application

Roxanna Normark and Christine Barber-Just joined us to present their Pickleball proposal.

They are hoping for a letter of support for their CPC application. The application is written; they will send it to Hannah, who will forward it to the Trustees.

At first, the discussion was positive: we think that some kind of physical activity is a good use for the field. But we do have concerns about noise (Richard pointed out that pickleball noise level is quite high), and whether that would interfere with the ambience of the adjacent park now under construction and which we imagine as a place of repose. The pickleball committee is looking into noise mitigation, such as shrubbery; they are willing to avoid library open hours and events. Parking could also be problematic, but they are willing to have participants park on the road.

We need to review their CPC proposal and to have time for further reflection and discussion, so we postponed any definitive support or non-support until our next Trustees meeting.
