## Second Draft of Section 4: Environmental Inventory and Analysis

- P. 4-3, Table 4-1: Revise title to clarify intent. (possible example below)
  - Table 4-1: *BioMap2* Statewide Summary

	Percent of State	Total Acres	Acres Protected in Perpetuity
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- P.4-4,5 : Removed info about climate from Amherst; replaced with MA Climate Change Projections (NE Climate Science Center)
- P. 4-6 Fig 4-1: corrected title
- P. 4-7 ~ 4-10: Geology section to be revised. Laurie? Miho will also get in touch with Sheila and Mike
  - MAP: SOILS
    - To be reviewed
- P4-10: Sentence to be revised: "Glacial outwash surfaces have since been dissected by streams.
   Long Plain Brook, for example, has carved a small gorge in a delta that formed as a result of the glacial Lake Hitchcock."
- P. 4-10: Added info on prime farmland soils; numbers to be added (Pat)
- P4-11: replace 'old library' with 'Field Family Museum (old library)'
- P4-11: 'C.1 Potential Changes in Development' has been removed here, as it is repeated later in section H.9 New Development
- P4-12: Maps are now referred to by name, not numbers. Added info on Watersheds.
- P4-13: Has been updated to consolidate rivers
  - Eva will look into historic names associated with Unnamed tributaries 12 14
- P4-13 ~ 14: Miho will reach out to the Friends of Leverett Pond again for their comments.
   (Mitch, Jim Field)
- P.4-14,15: Miho & Eva are working on getting more information on Leverett's wetlands by working with Ralph Tiner and his GIS dataset. Information from the 1970s has been removed
  - Miho will reach out to Ralph to review wetlands section
  - MAP: Wetland Resources: to be reviewed by Ralph
    - Change vernal pool icons
    - Interim wellhead protection areas?
    - Wetland names?
- P4-18 4-19: Removed FEMA flood hazard areas in preference for flood prone roadways identified in 2014 Leverett Hazard Mitigation Plan and 2010 Leverett Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan.

- Although they are outdated (1980), the FEMA maps are the official source for flood hazard area delineation. They should probably be recognized as such. How/How much?
- Miho will check for updates to the 2014 Hazard Mitigation Plan and 2010 Emergency Management Plan; contact Margie to review?
  - Is Hemenway Rd really a flood hazard area?
  - Which Sawmill River Bridge?
- P4-19: Added info on hardwoods, as forests in many nearby towns are mainly white pine.
   Incorporated feedback from Bill Wilson
- P4-19: "... disturbances in the past two centuries before colonial settlement."
- P4-20: Tropical Storm Irene add more local info/anecdotes?
- P4-20: Remove information about 1998 ice storm, as it did not have a significant effect in Leverett. Add date for 'Snowtober' -- October 31, 2011.
- P4-22: Incorporated information from Fire Chief. Confirm green section (re: 2010 brush fire)
- P 4-22 ~ 23: Pat incorporated some neutral language as suggested by Mary Alice. More work needed in the forestry section to remove value statements. **Isaiah, Andrew to review**
- P. 4-24: Updated to include info that maple trees on Amherst Rd are dead/dying. Includes information on benefits of shade trees and USFS iTree program. Continue to remove phrases with 'must' or 'should.'
  - Review by Ken Kahn?
- P4-27: Added reference to moose. Removed erroneous information about salmon. Photo by George LoCascio.
- P4-28: Information on wood turtle observation updated. Add information on Eastern Pearlshell
  mussel (Margaritifera margaritifera)? (identified as a 'Species of Greatest Conservation Need" in
  the MA State Wildlife Action Plan, but not state-listed rank 'SU')
- P4-29: 'Brushy Mountain archaeological sites' to 'Brushy Mountain historical sites.'
- P4-30 4-31: Need input on Table 4-4: Significant Scenic/Historic/Natural Landscapes/Environments in Leverett
  - Add info from historical resources survey Historical commission

## MAP: Significant Scenic/Historic/Natural Landscapes/Environments in Leverett

- Reviewed/confirmed locations
- Try LIDAR for background. Eva will send shape files to Pat
- Darken all roads to black
- Add vistas? (Using a different icon)
- Isaiah will ask about the Hemenway Rd Floral Site location
- Honeymoon Falls Gorge no longer exists
- Where is the 'Long Plain Rest Stop'? What is its value?
- Sawmill River Waterfall no public access, but is visible from road
- 'Gutter Gateway' to 'Rattlesnake Gutter'
- Add trails to the map
- Should we keep the polygons for Heritage Landscapes on the map? They are inaccurate, but match up with those mapped for the 2009 Heritage Landscape Inventory Report (DCR).
- Should all conservation areas be mapped here? (i.e., should we recognize their scenic/historic/natural value here?) Or save for open space map? Should we map just some? Which?
- We will plan *not* to include places of worship on this map, *unless* they are of scenic/historic/natural importance

- P. 4-33, 4-34: Eva: Include discussion on the impact of dying hemlocks on the Gutter (re: wooly adelgid)
  - Dying trees => rock falls. Will require a lot of management by the Town to keep the trail open to hiking.
- P.4-34: Brownfields site has been identified
- P. 4-35: The Conservation Commission has no recollection of the ATV discussion, so no progress has been made. This section could be reduced to an acknowledgement of the ATV problem only. (No solutions have been proposed.)
- P. 4-36: incorporated info from Margie on leaching problem. Miho to confirm number of families served by Housing assistance programs
- P. 4-36: Pat to send out letter from NHESP
  - 'Unprotected land on Joshua hill, east of Route 63' is protected (? partially?)
